## **A PROCLAMATION**

## BRAIN ANEURYSM AWARENESS MONTH

WHEREAS:

Brain aneurysms impact a wide age range of Americans, estimating that 1 out of every 50 individuals in the United States will have or has had a brain aneurysm;

and

WHEREAS:

Various risk factors can contribute to the formation of a brain aneurysm, including smoking, hypertension, and a family history of brain aneurysms; and

WHEREAS:

A subarachnoid hemorrhage can lead to brain damage, stroke, and death; and

WHEREAS:

Each year, more than 30,000 individuals in the United States suffer from ruptured brain aneurysms, 50 percent of whom die as a result; some have a

family history; and

WHEREAS:

Organizations such as The Brain Aneurysm Foundation, a nonprofit organization, make great strides in the effort of increased brain aneurysm awareness, education, support, advocacy, and research funding; now

THEREFORE:

I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim September 2023 as BRAIN ANEURYSM AWARENESS MONTH in Georgia.
