APROCLAMATION

chronic and rare conditions, the deadliest being cardiovascular, stroke, diabetes,

cancer, and obesity; and

WHEREAS: Chronic Disease Day is supported by advocacy organizations dedicated to assisting

patients overcome challenges with access to care throughout Georgia and across the

United States; and

WHEREAS: Chronic Disease Day promotes the availability of resources to reduce individual risk

and lower the rate of chronic disease across Georgia and our nation; and

WHEREAS: Raising public awareness of these diseases will continue to facilitate the discovery of

treatments and cures, as well as bringing the needed funding for support and services

for those affected by them; now

THEREFORE: I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim July 10,

2023 as CHRONIC DISEASE DAY in Georgia.
