A PROCLAMATION

CONSERVATION DISTRICT DAY

WHEREAS:

The Conservation Districts in the State of Georgia were established in 1937 following the Dust Bowl in response to depleted resources from irresponsible land use and management due to lack of education of and technical assistance with conservation practices; and

WHEREAS:

The Districts now, together with the U.S Department of Agriculture Natural Resources Conservation Service, connect landowners and users to resources with the mission of restoring natural resources and utilizing them in a sustainable way; and

WHEREAS:

Supervisors are elected and appointed officials who manage the forty districts and work with their communities to promote conservation practices and to represent local resource concerns; and

WHEREAS:

Through the Conservation Districts, citizens throughout Georgia have received conservation assistance through education, outreach, technical support, and cost-share programs, and present a unified voice and representation to the State; and

WHEREAS:

On Conservation District Day, the State of Georgia recognizes and encourages continued support of these Conservation Districts and the vital work they do; now

THEREFORE:

I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim March 7, 2023, as CONSERVATION DISTRICT DAY in Georgia.
