A PROCLAMATION

EHLERS-DANLOS SYNDROMES & HYPERMOBILIY SPECTRUM DISORDERS MONTH

- WHEREAS: Ehlers-Danlos syndromes (EDS) are a group of 13 heritable connective tissue disorders that together affect 1 in 5,000 people. Each type of EDS has its own set of symptoms, but some features are seen across all types of EDS, including joint hypermobility, skin hyperextensibility, and tissue fragility; and
- WHEREAS: Hypermobility spectrum disorders (HSD) are connective tissue disorders that cause joint hypermobility, instability, injury, and pain. Other symptoms, such as fatigue, headaches, GI problems, and autonomic dysfunction are also often seen as part of HSD; and

WHEREAS:There is no cure for any type of EDS or HSD. The conditions are managed by
addressing a person's symptoms. EDS and HSD can cause a variety of symptoms in
many different areas of the body, so people with these conditions often require
multiple providers in different specialties to manage their care; and

WHEREAS:Awareness about EDS and HSD by both medical professionals and the general public
can help improve the lives of people living with EDS and HSD in Georgia by making
room for more diagnosis, management, and research of these conditions; now

THEREFORE: I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim May 2023, as EHLERS-DANLOS SYNDROMES AND HYPERMOBILITY SPECTRUM DISORDERS MONTH in Georgia.
