A PROCLAMATION

ARBOR DAY

WHEREAS: The first Arbor Day was celebrated in 1872 as a special day for planting trees and has grown to thousands of celebrations in communities across our nation each year; and
WHEREAS: Community trees improve public health and air and water quality, reduce the erosion of precious topsoil, increase property values and economic vitality in

erosion of precious topsoil, increase property values and economic vitality in business areas, increase energy efficiency through shade, provide habitats for wildlife, and beautify neighborhoods, parks, streets, and residential developments; and

WHEREAS:Community forestry leaders and partners will be joined together in a celebration
of Arbor Day and recognition of the state's Tree City USA, Tree Campus USA,
and Tree Line USA partners and the Georgia Forestry Commission's urban and
community forestry program; and

WHEREAS: Georgia Forestry Commission's initiatives and celebration of Arbor Day encourages citizens to plant trees, leaving a legacy for present and future generations; now

THEREFORE: I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim February 17, 2023, as AMERICAN HEART MONTH in Georgia.
