## **A PROCLAMATION**

## HIGH POTASSIUM AWARENESS DAY

WHEREAS:

Nearly 40 million Americans have Chronic Kidney Disease (CKD); and

WHEREAS:

As high as 48.43% of the people with CKD and/or heart failure suffer from a

condition known as Hyperkalemia (high potassium); and

WHEREAS:

Hyperkalemia can cause weakness, fatigue, tingling, or numbness, naseu and vomiting,

difficulty breathing, paralysis, irregular heartbeat, heart attack, or sudden death from

cardia complications; and

WHEREAS:

Many at-risk patients are not fully aware of the risk factors or do not recognize the

signs of high potassium related issues; and

WHEREAS:

With increased awareness, Hyperkalemia (high potassium) can be more easily treated

and diagnosed, leading to better potassium levels among patients and overall better

lives; now

THEREFORE:

I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim May 1,

2023, as HIGH POTASSIUM AWARENESS DAY in Georgia.
