## **A PROCLAMATION**

## **KIDNEY MONTH**

WHEREAS: Kidney disease affects millions of adults in the United States, with an estimated

1 in 3 adults in the United States being at risk; and

WHEREAS: Healthy kidneys are essential for regulating our bodies by removing fluids,

waste, and toxins. They release hormones to help regulate blood pressure,

produce red blood cells, and strengthen our bones; and

WHEREAS: Many Americans are unaware that the risk factors for kidney disease include

diabetes, heart disease, high blood pressure, obesity, and family history, with

diabetes being a leading cause of kidney disease; and

WHEREAS: It is critical to increase awareness about this often-overlooked health crisis to

draw attention to the possible risks and to ultimately save lives; and

WHEREAS: The month of March is National Kidney Month and March 9, 2023, is World

Kidney Day, and the National Kidney Foundation actively participates in raising awareness of kidney disease and those who are at risk across the country; now

THEREFORE: I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim

March 2023, as KIDNEY MONTH in Georgia.
