A PROCLAMATION

LAO HERITAGE MONTH

WHEREAS:	The United States of America recognized the Kingdom of Laos on February 7, 1950; and
WHEREAS:	Many Lao people courageously fought alongside Americans during the Vietnam War despite retribution from the Vietnamese and Laotian governments; and
WHEREAS:	Georgia is home to a significant number of Laotian Americans, many of whom were provided political asylum and citizenship because of their unique contributions to American Interests; and
WHEREAS:	The Lao community of Georgia has made significant contributions to our state's diverse culture, tradition, language, and population including preserving and promoting the rich Lao heritage; and
WHEREAS:	Laotian Americans contribute positively to the social, educational, political, civic, cultural, and economic well-being of our state with hundreds of businesses and community organizations in the region; and
WHEREAS:	April is Lao New Year, and it is celebrated throughout the world by Laotians; now
THEREFORE:	I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim April 2023, as LAO HERITAGE MONTH in Georgia.
