A PROCLAMATION

NARCOLEPSY AWARENESS DAY

- WHEREAS:** Narcolepsy is a chronic neurological disorder caused by the brain's inability to regulate sleep-wake cycles; and
- WHEREAS:** Narcolepsy is an often under-recognized and under diagnosed condition that affects an estimated 1 in every 2,000 Americans; and
- WHEREAS:** Narcolepsy affects people neurologically, socially, and emotionally and its symptoms, especially when undiagnosed, can lead to accidents, injuries, and problems with learning and working; and
- WHEREAS:** Narcolepsy affects people of all ages, with onset typically between the ages of 15 and 25; and
- WHEREAS:** Narcolepsy Network is a national organization created to promote awareness of the disease and support for those who suffer from narcolepsy; now
- THEREFORE:** I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim March 11, 2023, as NARCOLEPSY AWARENESS DAY in Georgia.
