A PROCLAMATION

NATIONAL SAFETY MONTH

- WHEREAS:** Unintentional injuries and deaths can be the result of a lack of overall preparation for emergencies and natural disasters or knowledge of general safety precautions; and
- WHEREAS:** The cost of unintentional injuries can be insurmountable to workers and their employers and causes great suffering among individuals and their families; and
- WHEREAS:** Georgia residents and all workers deserve to live in communities that promote safe and healthy living; and
- WHEREAS:** Preventing unintentional injuries and deaths requires the cooperation of all levels of government, employers, and the general public; and
- WHEREAS:** The State of Georgia and organizations such as The National Safety Council Southeastern Chapter work to promote best practices to increase safety, protection, and health in business and industry, in schools and colleges, on roads and highways, and in homes and communities; and
- WHEREAS:** The summer months create a season of increased risk of unintentional injuries, and Georgians are encouraged to learn how to prepare for and ultimately prevent the possibility of unintentional harm; now
- THEREFORE:** I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim June 2023, as NATIONAL SAFETY MONTH in Georgia.
