advance quality care to Americans with kidney disease before they suffer complete organ failure, increase awareness in local communities, positively influence patient outcomes, and keep nephrology nurses abreast of the latest

treatments and kidney-related research; and

WHEREAS: Along with the American Nephrology Nurses Association, the Dogwood

Chapter has declared the week of September 10 through 16, 2023, as Nephrology Nurses Week to celebrate and honor the work nephrology nurses perform each day to maintain the health of thousands of individuals with kidney

disease; and

WHEREAS: The State of Georgia celebrates nephrology nursing's efforts to advance patient

care and reduce the incidence of kidney disease, and shows appreciation for
