A PROCLAMATION

PEDIATRIC FEEDING DISORDER (PFD) AWARENESS MONTH

WHEREAS:	The American Academy of Pediatrics and the Centers for Disease Control and
	Prevention identify nutrition during the first 1,000 days of life as a critical factor to
	early brain growth, development of the central nervous system, and lifelong mental
	health; and

- **WHEREAS:** The Journal of Pediatric Gastroenterology and Nutrition defines pediatric feeding disorder (PFD) as impaired oral intake that is not age-appropriate and is associated with medical, nutritional, feeding skill, and/or psychosocial dysfunction; and
- **WHEREAS:** Every bite of food for children with PFD can be painful, scary, or simply impossible to swallow, potentially impeding nutrition, development, growth, and overall well-being; and
- **WHEREAS:** PFD can affect all aspects of life, placing medical, emotional, financial, educational, and social burdens on children and families alike; and
- WHEREAS:Raising awareness for pediatric feeding disorder (PFD) will help create a world in
which children with PFD will thrive by accelerating identification, igniting research,
and promoting collaborative care and support for children and families; now
- **THEREFORE:** I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim May 2023, as PEDIATRIC FEEDING DISORDER (PFD) AWARENESS MONTH in Georgia.
