WHEREAS:	PAs have earned the respect of the general public for their dedication and contributions to people's lives and for their commitment to team-based care and ensure delivery of effective and efficient healthcare services; and
WHEREAS:	To celebrate the hardworking PAs across the state, the State of Georgia is proud to recognize Physician Assistant Week; now
