A PROCLAMATION

RADON ACTION MONTH

WHEREAS: Radon is a colorless, odorless, naturally occurring radioactive gas that threatens the

health of Georgia citizens; and

WHEREAS: The U.S. Surgeon General has warned that radon is the nation's second-leading cause

of lung cancer. According to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), radon

exposure is the top cause of lung cancer among non-smokers; and

WHEREAS: One in 15 homes in the U.S. is estimated to display an elevated radon level. Any home

in Georgia may have an elevated radon level, even if other homes in the same

neighborhood do not present such risks; and

WHEREAS: Testing for radon is simple and inexpensive, and provides an effective method for

identifying and addressing issues that may easily be fixed; and

WHEREAS: Radon Action Month provides an opportunity to increase awareness of the health risks

associated with in-home radon exposure and the importance of radon testing in

recognizing such harmful gases; and

WHEREAS: The University of Georgia's College of Family and Consumer Sciences, the Georgia

Department of Community Affairs, and the EPA are among the entities that encourage Georgia citizens to test places of residence for elevated levels of radon and

to build new homes with radon-resistant materials and features; now

THEREFORE: I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim January

2023, as RADON ACTION MONTH in Georgia.

In witness thereof, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Seal of the Executive Department to be affixed this 3rd day of January in the year of our Lord, Two Thousand and Twenty-Three.
