## **A PROCLAMATION**

## REENTRY AWARENESS MONTH

WHEREAS:

Over 4.2 million Georgians have a criminal record on file with the Georgia Crime

Information Center resulting in them facing collateral consequences of their

incarceration; and

WHEREAS:

Returning to the community after incarceration is a difficult transition, and an effective

reentry process is vital to providing those in Georgia's corrections systems with

renewed opportunities for success; and

WHEREAS:

Reentry empowers returning citizens to refrain from crime and incentivizes law-

abiding behavior, thus supporting public safety throughout the State; and

WHEREAS:

Supporting and bringing awareness to reentry restores families, builds stronger communities, and eliminates obstacles that prevent returning citizens from finding

meaningful employment and housing; and

WHEREAS:

By eliminating negative stigmas associated with having a criminal record and

promoting compassion and kindness, we can help returning citizens strive for brighter

futures; and

WHEREAS:

Georgia's efforts in providing pathways to remove barriers to employment and

housing and to offering returning citizens access to resources that assist and support

them upon reentry are commendable; and

THEREFORE:

I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim July 2023,

as REENTRY AWARENESS MONTH in Georgia.
