APROCLAMATION

REUNIFICATION MONTH

WHEREAS: Foster care is intended to be a temporary intervention for children who need the safety

and security of an out-of-home placement; and

WHEREAS: Reunification takes work, commitment, and investment of time and resources by

parents, family members, social workers, caregivers, service providers, judicial

partners, and other community members; and

WHEREAS: Whenever possible, keeping families together in their home is an important goal for

Georgia families; and all children and youth deserve to be safe; children do best when

raised in families; and

WHEREAS: For most children in foster care, reunification with their family is their best option for

a permanent and loving home; and

WHEREAS: All children need the care, love, security, and stability of family unity, including parents,

siblings, grandparents, and other extended family members to provide a solid

foundation for personal growth, development, and maturity; and

WHEREAS: Over 1800 children exited foster care via reunification in 2022; and

WHEREAS: The accomplishments of families who have overcome an array of challenges to reunify

safely and successfully should be supported and celebrated; and

THEREFORE: I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim June 2023,

as REUNIFICATION MONTH in Georgia.
