## **A PROCLAMATION**

## SAFE BOATING WEEK

WHEREAS:	The State of Georgia is blessed with many beautiful and accessible coastal waters, freshwater rivers, and lakes, many of which offer the freedom and ability for Georgians to use for personal recreation and enjoyment; and
WHEREAS:	An average of 650 people perish each year in boating-related accidents in the United States. Over 80% of these fatalities are caused by drowning, many of which could be prevented by wearing a life jacket; and
WHEREAS:	The growing popularity of recreational boating and related water sports has increased the responsibilities of the Georgia Department of Natural Resources and the U.S. Coast Guard, as well as volunteer organizations such as the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary and the U.S. Power Squadrons – America's Boating Club, who strive to ensure the safety of the boating public; and
WHEREAS:	Boaters are required to have a U.S. Coast Guard-approved wearable life jacket on board and available for each person on the boat. Boating safety advocates recommend that all boaters and passengers not only have a life jacket, but also wear it while boating; and
WHEREAS:	During Georgia Safe Boating Week and throughout the year, dedicated enforcement officers, as well as volunteer organizations, provide Georgia citizens with the knowledge and skills to become safer and more responsible boaters; and
WHEREAS:	Georgians are encouraged to spread the message of boating safety, urging fellow boaters to check the weather, file a float plan, stay sober, and follow State and Coast Guard regulations. Boating safety knowledge and skills are important in reducing human error, improving judgment, and ultimately saving lives; now
THEREFORE:	I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim May 20- 26, 2023, as SAFE BOATING WEEK in Georgia.

In witness thereof, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Seal of the Executive Department to be affixed this 28<sup>th</sup> day of April in the year of our Lord, Two Thousand and Twenty-Three.
