A PROCLAMATION

SEPSIS AWARENESS MONTH

WHEREAS:

Sepsis is one's bodily reaction to an infection and is a life-threatening

condition which can lead to tissue damage, organ failure, or death; and

WHEREAS:

Any type of infection (bacterial, viral, fungal, or parasitic) can lead to sepsis and

cause a medical emergency which requires rapid diagnosis and treatment; and

WHEREAS:

According to the Centers for Disease Control, sepsis affects 1.7 million Americans and takes 270,000 adult lives every year in the United States. Although anyone can develop sepsis, young children, the elderly, and those which chronic illnesses or compromised immune systems are at the highest risk;

and

WHEREAS:

The signs of sepsis can be remembered with the mnemonic device from Sepsis Alliance: "Sepsis, It's About TIMETM," which stands for Temperature,

Infection, Mental decline and extremely ill; and

WHEREAS:

Awareness of the signs and symptoms of sepsis along with rapid diagnosis and treatment can save lives and improve outcomes of survivors. It is important to be aware of sepsis and support hardworking healthcare workers helping patients across Georgia and our nation; now

THEREFORE:

I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim September 2023, as SEPSIS AWARENESS MONTH in Georgia.
