A PROCLAMATION

TAIWANESE AMERICAN HERITAGE WEEK

WHEREAS: Taiwanese Americans have made significant contributions to our society, economy,

culture, and other fields. This week presents an opportunity to introduce and share the Taiwanese American culture and heritage through festivities and celebrations in

communities across the state; and

WHEREAS: Many Taiwanese Americans in Georgia are employed in highly skilled professions,

such as university professors, medical doctors, engineers, technology professionals,

attorneys, business professionals, and entrepreneurs; and

WHEREAS: The Taiwanese community in Atlanta supports a Taiwanese-speaking Presbyterian

church in Duluth, as well as two Taiwanese Language and Culture schools that teach

children about Taiwanese culture, music, customs, and language; and

WHEREAS: Organizations across the state, including the Atlanta Taiwanese American Association,

provide networking, support, and camaraderie for Taiwanese Americans in Georgia;

and

WHEREAS: During Asian American Heritage Month, we celebrate Taiwanese American Heritage

Week and reflect on the ways in which Taiwanese Americans have enriched the State

of Georgia; now

THEREFORE: I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim May 28 –

June 3, 2023, as TAIWANESE AMERICAN HERITAGE WEEK in Georgia.
