## A PROCLAMATION

### TESTICULAR CANCER AWARENESS MONTH

- WHEREAS:** Testicular cancer is the most common cancer found in men aged 15 to 34; and
- WHEREAS:** Although the number of new cases of testicular cancer has doubled in the last 40 years, the number of deaths caused by testicular cancer has decreased greatly because of better treatments; and
- WHEREAS:** Testicular cancer is usually treatable if detected early, by self-examinations and regular visits to a healthcare provider; and
- WHEREAS:** Testicular cancer not only affects men but also affects their family and friends; and
- WHEREAS:** Increased awareness about the risks, symptoms, and treatments options will encourage men to learn how to do a self-exam and discuss testicular cancer with their healthcare professional; now
- THEREFORE:** I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim April 2023, as TESTICULAR CANCER AWARENESS MONTH in Georgia.
