## House Bill 748 (AS PASSED HOUSE AND SENATE)

## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To provide an additional homestead exemption from Gwinnett County school district ad
- 2 valorem taxes for educational purposes in the amount of \$2,000.00 of the assessed value of
- 3 the homestead for residents of that school district who are certain public service employees;
- 4 to provide for definitions; to specify the terms and conditions of the exemption and the
- 5 procedures relating thereto; to provide for applicability; to provide for compliance with
- 6 constitutional requirements; to provide for a referendum, effective dates, automatic repeal,
- 7 mandatory execution of election, and judicial remedies regarding failure to comply; to repeal
- 8 conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

- 11 (a) As used in this Act, the term:
- 12 (1) "Ad valorem taxes for educational purposes" means all ad valorem taxes for
- educational purposes levied by, for, or on behalf of the Gwinnett County school district,
- except for any ad valorem taxes to pay interest on and to retire county school district
- bonded indebtedness.

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16 (2) "Homestead" means homestead as defined and qualified in Code Section 48-5-40 of

- the O.C.G.A., as amended.
- 18 (3) "Public service employee" means a person who is, on or before January 1 of the year
- in which application for the exemption under subsection (b) of this section is made, a:
- 20 (A) Firefighter, paramedic, certified peace officer, or other law enforcement officer
- 21 employed by the government of the United States or any department, agency, authority,
- or bureau thereof or by the State of Georgia or any county, municipality, special
- district, county or independent school system, or other political subdivision thereof;
- 24 (B) Teacher, paraprofessional, or administrator employed by the Gwinnett County
- 25 School District or Buford City School District;
- 26 (C) Person employed by or holding staff privileges at a hospital located within
- 27 Gwinnett County; or
- 28 (D) Member of the armed forces of the United States, including any reserve or
- National Guard components and the United States Coast Guard.
- 30 (b) Each resident of the Gwinnett County school district who is a public service employee
- 31 is granted an additional exemption on that person's homestead from Gwinnett County school
- 32 district ad valorem taxes for educational purposes in the amount of \$2,000.00 of the assessed
- value of that homestead. The value of that property in excess of such exempted amount shall
- 34 remain subject to taxation.
- 35 (c) A person shall not receive the homestead exemption granted by subsection (b) of this
- 36 section unless such person or person's agent files an application with the tax commissioner
- of Gwinnett County, giving the person's age and such additional information relative to
- 38 receiving such exemption as will enable the tax commissioner or the board of tax assessors
- 39 of Gwinnett County to make a determination regarding the initial and continuing eligibility
- 40 of such person for such exemption. The tax commissioner or the board of tax assessors of
- 41 Gwinnett County shall provide application forms for this purpose.

42 (d) The exemption shall be claimed and returned as provided in Code Section 48-5-50.1 of 43 the O.C.G.A., as amended. The exemption shall be automatically renewed from year to year 44 as long as the person granted the homestead exemption under subsection (b) of this section 45 occupies the residence as a homestead. After a person has filed the proper application as provided in subsection (c) of this section, it shall not be necessary to make application 46 47 thereafter for any year, and the exemption shall continue to be allowed to such person. It 48 shall be the duty of any person granted the homestead exemption under subsection (b) of this 49 section to notify the tax commissioner of Gwinnett County in the event that such person for 50 any reason becomes ineligible for such exemption. 51 (e) The exemption granted by subsection (b) of this section shall not apply to or affect any 52 state ad valorem taxes, county ad valorem taxes for county purposes, municipal ad valorem 53 taxes for municipal purposes, or independent school district ad valorem taxes for educational 54 purposes. The homestead exemption granted by subsection (b) of this section shall be in 55 addition to and not in lieu of any other homestead exemption applicable to Gwinnett County school district ad valorem taxes for educational purposes. 56 57 (f) The exemption granted by subsection (b) of this section shall apply to all taxable years 58 beginning on or after January 1, 2025.

59 SECTION 2.

In accordance with the requirements of Article VII, Section II of the Constitution of the State of Georgia, this Act shall not become law unless it receives the requisite two-thirds' majority vote in both the Senate and the House of Representatives.

63 SECTION 3.

The election superintendent of Gwinnett County shall call and conduct an election as provided in this section for the purpose of submitting this Act to the electors of the Gwinnett County school district for approval or rejection. The election superintendent shall conduct

that election on the date of the general primary in 2024 and shall issue the call and conduct that election as provided by general law. The election superintendent shall cause the date and purpose of the election to be published once a week for two weeks immediately preceding the date thereof in the official organ of Gwinnett County. The ballot shall have written or printed thereon the words:

72 "() YES Shall the Act be approved which provides an additional homestead 73 exemption from Gwinnett County school district ad valorem taxes for 74 () NO educational purposes in the amount of \$2,000.00 of the assessed value of the 75 homestead for residents of that school district who are public service 76 employees?"

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All persons desiring to vote for approval of the Act shall vote "Yes," and all persons desiring to vote for rejection of the Act shall vote "No." If more than one-half of the votes cast on such question are for approval of the Act, Section 1 of this Act shall become of full force and effect on January 1, 2025. If the Act is not so approved or if the election is not conducted as provided in this section, Section 1 of this Act shall not become effective, and this Act shall be automatically repealed on the first day of January immediately following that election date. The expense of such election shall be borne by Gwinnett County. It shall be the election superintendent's duty to certify the result thereof to the Secretary of State. The provisions of this section shall be mandatory upon the election superintendent and are not intended as directory. If the election superintendent fails or refuses to comply with this section, any elector of the Gwinnett County school district may apply for a writ of mandamus to compel the election superintendent to perform his or her duties under this section. If the court finds that the election superintendent has not complied with this section, the court shall fashion appropriate relief requiring the election superintendent to call and conduct such election on the date required by this section or on the next date authorized for special elections provided for in Code Section 21-2-540 of the O.C.G.A.

93 **SECTION 4.** 

- 94 Except as otherwise provided in Section 3 of this Act, this Act shall become effective upon
- 95 its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law without such approval.

97 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
