House Bill 766 (AS PASSED HOUSE AND SENATE) By: Representatives Wiedower of the 121st and Gaines of the 120th

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1 To provide a homestead exemption from Oconee County school district ad valorem taxes for 2 educational purposes in the amount of \$3,000.00 of the assessed value of the homestead for 3 residents of that county; to provide for the automatic increase of such exemption to \$8,000.00 of the assessed value of the homestead for residents of that county on January 1, 2035; to 4 5 provide for definitions; to specify the terms and conditions of the exemption and the procedures relating thereto; to provide for applicability; to provide for compliance with 6 7 constitutional requirements; to provide for a referendum, effective dates, automatic repeal, 8 mandatory execution of election, and judicial remedies regarding failure to comply; to 9 provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

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SECTION 1.

12 (a) As used in this Act, the term:

(1) "Ad valorem taxes for educational purposes" means all ad valorem taxes for
educational purposes levied by, for, or on behalf of the Oconee County school district,
except for any ad valorem taxes to pay interest on and to retire county school district
bonded indebtedness.

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17 (2) "Homestead" means homestead as defined and qualified in Code Section 48-5-40 of
18 the O.C.G.A., as amended.

(b)(1) Each resident of the Oconee County school district is granted an exemption on that
person's homestead from Oconee County school district ad valorem taxes for educational
purposes in the amount of \$3,000.00 of the assessed value of that homestead. The value
of that property in excess of such exempted amount shall remain subject to taxation.

(2) The exemption granted to each resident of the Oconee County school district shall
automatically increase to \$8,000.00 of the assessed value of that homestead on January 1,
2035.

(c) A person shall not receive the homestead exemption granted by subsection (b) of this section unless such person or person's agent files an application with the tax commissioner of Oconee County, giving such information relative to receiving such exemption as will enable the tax commissioner of Oconee County to make a determination regarding the initial and continuing eligibility of such person for such exemption. The tax commissioner of Oconee County shall provide application forms for this purpose.

(d) The exemption shall be claimed and returned as provided in Code Section 48-5-50.1 of 32 33 the O.C.G.A., as amended. The exemption shall be automatically renewed from year to year 34 so long as the person granted the homestead exemption under subsection (b) of this section 35 occupies the residence as a homestead. After a person has filed the proper application as 36 provided in subsection (c) of this section, it shall not be necessary to make application 37 thereafter for any year, and the exemption shall continue to be allowed to such person. It 38 shall be the duty of any person granted the homestead exemption under subsection (b) of this 39 section to notify the tax commissioner of Oconee County in the event that such person for any reason becomes ineligible for such exemption. 40

41 (e) The exemption granted by subsection (b) of this section shall not apply to or affect any
42 state ad valorem taxes, county ad valorem taxes for county purposes, municipal ad valorem
43 taxes for municipal purposes, or independent school district ad valorem taxes for educational

purposes. The homestead exemption granted by subsection (b) of this section shall be in
addition to and not in lieu of any other homestead exemption applicable to Oconee County
school district ad valorem taxes for educational purposes.

47 (f) The exemption granted by subsection (b) of this section, except as otherwise provided

- 48 in that subsection, shall apply to all taxable years beginning on or after January 1, 2025.
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SECTION 2.

50 In accordance with the requirements of Article VII, Section II of the Constitution of the State

51 of Georgia, this Act shall not become law unless it receives the requisite two-thirds' majority

52 vote in both the Senate and the House of Representatives.

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SECTION 3.

54 The election superintendent of Oconee County shall call and conduct an election as provided 55 in this section for the purpose of submitting this Act to the electors of the Oconee County school district for approval or rejection. The election superintendent shall conduct that 56 57 election on the date of the general primary in 2024 and shall issue the call and conduct that 58 election as provided by general law. The election superintendent shall cause the date and 59 purpose of the election to be published once a week for two weeks immediately preceding 60 the date thereof in the official organ of Oconee County. The ballot shall have written or printed thereon the words: 61

() YES Shall the Act be approved which provides a homestead exemption from
() NO Oconee County school district ad valorem taxes for educational purposes in
the amount of \$3,000.00, automatically increasing to \$8,000.00 on
January 1, 2035, of the assessed value of the homestead for residents of that
school district, provided that all of the other homestead exemption questions
on this ballot are approved?"

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All persons desiring to vote for approval of the Act shall vote "Yes," and all persons desiring to vote for rejection of the Act shall vote "No." If more than one-half of the votes cast on such question are for approval of the Act, and more than one-half of the votes cast on each of the questions regarding the following Acts are for approval of such Acts:

(1) An Act to provide a \$3,000.00 exemption from Oconee County ad valorem taxes for
county purposes, with an automatic increase of such exemption to \$8,000.00 on
January 1, 2035;

(2) An Act to repeal the homestead exemption granted from Oconee County school
district ad valorem taxes for educational purposes to certain residents of that school
district, approved March 27, 1998 (Ga. L. 1998, p. 3568);

(3) An Act to repeal the homestead exemption granted from Oconee County ad valorem
taxes for county purposes to certain residents of that county, approved March 27, 1998
(Ga. L. 1998, p. 3576);

 (5) An Act to close to new applications the homestead exemption granted from Oconee

- (6) An Act granting a homestead exemption from Oconee County ad valorem taxes for
 county purposes in an amount equal to the amount by which the current year assessed
 value of the homestead exceeds the base year assessed value of such homestead for
 residents of that county who are 65 years of age or over;
- 90 (7) An Act granting a homestead exemption from Oconee County school district ad
 91 valorem taxes for educational purposes in an amount equal to the amount by which the
 92 current year assessed value of the homestead exceeds the base year assessed value of such
 93 homestead for residents of that county who are 65 years of age or over;

94 (8) An Act granting a homestead exemption from Oconee County ad valorem taxes for
95 county purposes in the amount of \$10,000.00 for residents of that county who are 75
96 years of age or older; and

97 (9) An Act granting a homestead exemption from Oconee County school district ad
98 valorem taxes for educational purposes in the amount of \$10,000.00 for residents of that
99 county who are 75 years of age or older,

100 Section 1 of this Act shall become of full force and effect on January 1, 2025. If the Act, or 101 any one of the Acts provided for in paragraphs (1) through (9) of this section are not so approved, or if the election on the Act or any of the Acts provided for in paragraphs (1) 102 103 through (9) of this section is not conducted as provided in this section, Section 1 of this Act 104 shall not become effective, and this Act shall be automatically repealed on the first day of January immediately following that election date. The expense of such election shall be 105 borne by Oconee County. It shall be the election superintendent's duty to certify the result 106 107 thereof to the Secretary of State. The provisions of this section shall be mandatory upon the election superintendent and are not intended as directory. If the election superintendent fails 108 109 or refuses to comply with this section, any elector of Oconee County may apply for a writ 110 of mandamus to compel the election superintendent to perform his or her duties under this 111 section. If the court finds that the election superintendent has not complied with this section, 112 the court shall fashion appropriate relief requiring the election superintendent to call and 113 conduct such election on the date required by this section or on the next date authorized for 114 special elections provided for in Code Section 21-2-540 of the O.C.G.A.

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SECTION 4.

116 Except as otherwise provided in Section 3 of this Act, this Act shall become effective upon

117 its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law without such approval, provided that:

(1) An Act to provide a \$3,000.00 exemption from Oconee County ad valorem taxes for
county purposes, with an automatic increase of such exemption to \$8,000.00 on
January 1, 2035;

(2) An Act to repeal the homestead exemption granted from Oconee County school
district ad valorem taxes for educational purposes to certain residents of that school
district, approved March 27, 1998 (Ga. L. 1998, p. 3568);

(3) An Act to repeal the homestead exemption granted from Oconee County ad valorem

(Ga. L. 1998, p. 3576);

(4) An Act to repeal the homestead exemption granted from Oconee County ad valorem
taxes to certain residents of that county, approved May 4, 2006 (Ga. L. 2006, p. 4132);
(5) An Act to close to new applications the homestead exemption granted from Oconee
County ad valorem taxes to certain residents of that county, approved May 4, 2006 (Ga.
L. 2006, p. 4127);

- (6) An Act granting a homestead exemption from Oconee County ad valorem taxes for
 county purposes in an amount equal to the amount by which the current year assessed
 value of the homestead exceeds the base year assessed value of such homestead for
 residents of that county who are 65 years of age or over;
- (7) An Act granting a homestead exemption from Oconee County school district ad
 valorem taxes for educational purposes in an amount equal to the amount by which the
 current year assessed value of the homestead exceeds the base year assessed value of such
 homestead for residents of that county who are 65 years of age or over;
- (8) An Act granting a homestead exemption from Oconee County ad valorem taxes for
 county purposes in the amount of \$10,000.00 for residents of that county who are 75
 years of age or older; and

 valorem taxes for educational purposes in the amount of \$10,000.00 for residents of that
 county who are 75 years of age or older
- are enacted in the 2023 regular session of the General Assembly; if each such Act is not soenacted, this Act shall not become effective and shall be automatically repealed on

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SECTION 5.

150 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
