A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1 To amend an Act to provide a new charter for the City of Blackshear, approved March 19,

2 1993 (Ga. L. 1993, p. 4091), as amended, so as to decrease the size of the city council from

six to five members; to update provisions relating to elections, meetings, organization, and

voting of the city council; to change the description of the council districts; to provide for

definitions and inclusions; to provide for manner of election; to provide for the continuation

in office of current members; to revise provisions related to vacancies in the offices of mayor

or councilmembers; to revise provisions related to the city attorney, city clerk, and city

accountant; to abolish the office of city treasurer; to revise provisions relating to city rules

and regulations related to employees; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting

10 laws; and for other purposes.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

13 An Act to provide a new charter for the City of Blackshear, approved March 19, 1993 (Ga.

14 L. 1993, p. 4091), as amended, is amended by revising Sections 2.10 through 2.12 as follows:

15 "SECTION 2.10.

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16 City council creation; composition; number; election.

17 (a) The legislative authority of the government of this city, except as otherwise specifically
18 provided in this charter, shall be vested in a city council to be composed of a mayor and
19 five councilmembers. The mayor and city councilmembers shall be elected as provided by
20 general law and this charter.

(b) The mayor and councilmembers shall serve for terms of four years and until their respective successors are elected and qualified. No person shall be eligible to serve as mayor or councilmember unless he or she shall have been a resident of this city for 12 months immediately preceding the election of mayor or councilmember; each such person shall continue to reside within the city during that person's period of service and to be registered and qualified to vote in municipal elections of this city. In addition to the above requirements, no person shall be eligible to serve as a councilmember representing a council district unless that person has been a resident of the district such person seeks to represent for a continuous period of at least six months immediately prior to the date of the election for councilmember and continues to reside in such district during that person's period of service. No person's name shall be listed as a candidate on the ballot for election for either mayor or councilmember unless such person shall file a notice of his or her candidacy with the municipal superintendent as prescribed by Georgia law. No person shall be eligible for the office of mayor or councilmember unless such person shall file above said notice within the time provided for by the 'Georgia Election Code,' Chapter 2 of Title 21 of the O.C.G.A.

37 SECTION 2.11.
38 Elections.

- (a) At any election, all persons who are qualified under the Constitution and laws of
 Georgia to vote for members of the General Assembly of Georgia and who are bona fide
 residents of said city shall be eligible to qualify as voters in the election.
- (b) All primaries and elections shall be held and conducted in accordance with the Georgia
 Election Code as now or hereafter amended. Except as otherwise provided by this charter,
- 44 the city council shall, by ordinance, prescribe such rules and regulations it deems
- appropriate to fulfill any options and duties consistent with the Georgia Election Code.
- 46 (c) The mayor and those members of the city council who are serving as such on
- December 31, 2023, and any person elected to fill a vacancy in such office, shall continue
- 48 to serve as such mayor or members until the regular expiration of their respective terms of
- office and upon the election and qualification of their respective successors. On and after
- January 1, 2024, the governing authority of the City of Blackshear shall consist of five
- 51 councilmembers, all of whom shall be elected from council districts described in
- subsection (d) of this section and the mayor who is elected at large as provided in this
- 53 charter.
- 54 (d)(1) For the purpose of electing councilmembers, the City of Blackshear shall be
- divided into five council districts. One councilmember shall be elected from each such
- district. Districts 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5 shall be and correspond to those five numbered districts
- described in Appendix A attached to and made a part of this Act and further identified as
- 58 'User: Blackshear Plan Name: Blackshear CC-Import-2023 Plan Type: Local'.
- 59 (2) For the purposes of such plan:
- 60 (A) The term 'VTD' shall mean and describe the same geographical boundaries as 61 provided in the report of the Bureau of the Census for the United States decennial
- 62 census of 2020 for the State of Georgia. The separate numeric designations in a district

description which are underneath a VTD heading shall mean and describe individual Blocks within a VTD as provided in the report of the Bureau of the Census for the

- United States decennial census of 2020 for the State of Georgia; and
- 66 (B) Except as otherwise provided in the description of any district, whenever the
- description of any district refers to a named city, it shall mean the geographical
- boundaries of that city as shown on the census maps for the United States decennial
- census of 2020 for the State of Georgia.
- 70 (e)(1) Any part of the City of Blackshear which is not included in any district described
- in subsection (d) of this section shall be included within that district contiguous to such
- part which contains the least population according to the United States decennial census
- of 2020 for the State of Georgia.
- 74 (2) Except for an incorporated island, any part of the City of Blackshear which is
- described in subsection (d) of this section as being included in a particular district shall
- nevertheless not be included within such district if such part is not contiguous to such
- district. Such noncontiguous part shall instead be included within that district contiguous
- to such part which contains the least population according to the United States decennial
- 79 census of 2020 for the State of Georgia.
- 80 (3) Any territory purportedly described in a district in subsection (d) of this section that
- is not within the corporate limits of the City of Blackshear shall not be part of any such
- 82 district.

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- 83 (f) The mayor and members of the city council shall be elected as provided in this
- subsection. The members from Council Districts 1 and 2 shall be elected at the general
- election on the Tuesday next following the first Monday in November, 2023. Those first
- councilmembers elected thereto from Council Districts 1 and 2 in 2023 shall take office the
- 87 first day of January immediately following the election and shall serve for initial terms of
- office which expire December 31, 2027, and upon the election and qualification of their
- respective successors. The mayor and members from Council Districts 3, 4 and 5 shall be

elected at the general election on the Tuesday next following the first Monday in November, 2025. The mayor and councilmembers elected thereto from Council Districts 3, 4 and 5 in 2025 shall take office the first day of January immediately following that election and shall serve for initial terms of office which expire December 31, 2029, and upon the election and qualification of their respective successors. Those and all future successors to the mayor and members of the city council whose terms of office are to expire shall be elected at the time of the municipal general election immediately preceding the expiration of such terms, shall take office the first day of January immediately following that election, and shall serve for terms of office of four years each. The mayor and members of the city council shall serve for the terms of office specified therefor in this subsection and until their respective successors are elected and qualified.

101 SECTION 2.12.

Vacancy; filling of vacancies.

(a) The office of mayor or councilmember shall become vacant upon the incumbent's death, resignation, forfeiture of office, or occurrence of any event specified by the Constitution of the State of Georgia, Title 45 of the O.C.G.A., or such other applicable laws as are or may hereafter be enacted.

(b) A vacancy in the office of mayor or councilmember shall be filled for the remainder of the unexpired term, if any, by appointment by the city council or those members remaining if less than 12 months remains in the unexpired term. If such vacancy occurs 12 months or more prior to the expiration of the term of that office, it shall be filled for the remainder of the unexpired term by a special election, as provided for in Section 5.14 of this charter and in accordance with Titles 21 and 45 of the O.C.G.A., or other such laws as are or may hereafter be enacted.

114 (c) This provision shall also apply to a temporary vacancy created by the suspension from 115 office of the mayor or any councilmember."

SECTION 2.

117 Said Act is further amended by revising Section 3.11 as follows:

118 "SECTION 3.11.

Organization.

(a) The city council shall hold an organizational meeting at the first regular meeting in January following each regular election. The meeting shall be called to order by the mayor, mayor-elect, or city clerk and the oath of office shall be administered to the newly elected members by a judicial officer authorized to administer oaths or the city clerk and shall be, to the extent that it comports with federal and state law, as follows:

I do solemnly (swear)(affirm) that I will faithfully perform the duties of (mayor)(councilmember) of this city and that I will support and defend the charter thereof as well as the Constitution and laws of the State of Georgia and of the United States of America. I am not the holder of any unaccounted for public money due this state or any political subdivision or authority thereof. I am not the holder of any office of trust under the government of the United States, any other state, or any foreign state which I by the laws of the State of Georgia am prohibited from holding. I am otherwise qualified to hold said office according to the Constitution and laws of Georgia, and I will support the Constitution of the United States and of this state. I have been a resident of [my district and] the City of Blackshear, Georgia for the time required by the Constitution and laws of this state and by the municipal charter. I will perform the duties of my office in the best interest of the City of Blackshear, Georgia to the best of my ability without fear, favor, affection, reward, or expectation thereof.'

(b) By a majority vote, the city council shall elect a councilmember to serve as mayor pro tempore. The mayor pro tempore shall preside at all meetings of the city council and shall assume the duties and powers of the mayor during any disability or absence of the mayor. The city council shall by majority vote elect a presiding officer from its number for any period in which the mayor pro tempore is disabled, absent, or acting as mayor. Such absence or disability shall be declared by majority vote of the city council. When serving as mayor, the mayor pro tempore shall not also vote as a member of the council."

SECTION 3.

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146 Said Act is further amended by revising Section 3.13 as follows:

147 "SECTION 3.13.

Meetings.

- (a) The city council shall hold regular meetings at such times and places as prescribed byordinance.
- 151 (b) Special meetings of the city council may be held on call of the mayor or three 152 members of the city council. Notice of such special meeting shall be served on all other 153 members personally, or by telephone personally, at least 48 hours in advance of the 154 meeting. Such notice to councilmembers shall not be required if the mayor and all 155 councilmembers are present when the special meeting is called. Such notice of any special 156 meeting may be waived by a councilmember in writing before or after such a meeting and 157 attendance at the meeting shall also constitute a waiver of notice on any business transacted 158 in such councilmember's presence. Only the business stated in the call may be transacted 159 at the special meeting.
- 160 (c) All meetings of the city council shall be public to the extent required by law and notice 161 to the public of special meetings shall be made fully as is reasonably possible as provided

by Code Section 50-14-1 of the O.C.G.A., or other such applicable laws as are or may hereafter be enacted."

SECTION 4.

Said Act is further amended by revising Section 3.15 as follows:

166 "SECTION 3.15.

Voting.

- (a) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (b) of this section, three councilmembers shall constitute a quorum and shall be authorized to transact the business of the city council. Voting on the adoption of ordinances shall be by voice vote and the vote shall be recorded in the journal, but any member of the city council shall have the right to request a rollcall vote and such vote shall be recorded in the journal. Except as otherwise provided in this charter, the affirmative vote of a majority of the councilmembers present shall be required for the adoption of any ordinance, resolution, or motion.
- (b) No member of the city council shall abstain from voting on any matter properly brought before the council for official action except when such councilmember has a conflict of interest which is disclosed in writing prior to or at the meeting and made a part of the minutes. Any member of the city council present and eligible to vote on a matter and refusing to do so for any reason other than a properly disclosed and recorded conflict of interest shall be deemed to have acquiesced or concurred with the members of the majority who did vote on the question involved.
- (c) In the event vacancies in office result in less than a quorum of councilmembers holding office, then the remaining councilmembers in office shall constitute a quorum and shall be authorized to transact business of the city council. A vote of a majority of the remaining councilmembers shall be required for the adoption of any ordinance, resolution, or motion."

186 SECTION 5.

Said Act is further amended by revising Sections 4.12 through 4.15 as follows:

188 "SECTION 4.12.

189 City attorney.

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The city council shall appoint a city attorney, together with such assistant city attorneys as may be authorized, and shall provide for the payment of such attorney or attorneys for services rendered to the city. The city attorney shall be responsible for providing for the representation and defense of the city in all litigation in which the city is a party; may be the prosecuting officer in the municipal court; shall attend the meetings of the council as directed; shall advise the city council, mayor, and other officers and employees of the city concerning legal aspects of the city's affairs; and shall perform such other duties as may be required by virtue of the person's position as city attorney. The city attorney shall at all times be an independent contractor. A law firm, rather than an individual, may be designated as the city attorney.

200 SECTION 4.13.

201 City clerk.

- (a) The city council shall appoint a city clerk who shall not be a councilmember. The city clerk shall be custodian of the official city seal, maintain city council records required by this charter, and perform such other duties as may be required by the city council. The city council shall provide for the compensation of the city clerk.
- 206 (b) The city clerk shall be authorized to collect all taxes, licenses, fees, and other moneys 207 belonging to the city subject to the provisions of this charter and the ordinances of the city

208 and to enforce all laws of Georgia relating to the collection of delinquent taxes and the sale 209 or foreclosure for nonpayment of taxes by the city. 210 SECTION 4.14. 211 City accountant. 212 The mayor may appoint and the city council shall confirm a city accountant to perform the duties of accountant. 213 214 SECTION 4.15. 215 Rules and regulations. 216 The city council shall adopt rules and regulations consistent with this charter concerning: 217 (1) The method of employee selection and probationary periods of employment; 218 (2) The administration of a position classification and pay plan, methods of promotion 219 and applications of service ratings thereto, and transfer of employees within the 220 classification plan; 221 (3) Hours of work, vacation, sick leave, and other leaves of absence, overtime pay, and 222 the order and manner in which layoffs shall be effected; 223 (4) Such dismissal hearings as due process may require; and 224 (5) Such other personnel notices as may be necessary to provide for adequate and 225 systematic handling of personnel affairs." 226 **SECTION 6.** 227 Said Act is further amended by repealing Section 4.16.

228 **SECTION 7.**

229 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
