A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Article 1 of Chapter 3 of Title 35 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to general provisions concerning the Georgia Bureau of Investigation, so as to provide for independent and concurrent jurisdiction by the Georgia Bureau of Investigation in cases involving the identification, investigation, arrest, and prosecution of an individual or groups of individuals for violation of laws concerning domestic, cyber, biological, chemical, and nuclear terrorism; to provide for a short title; to provide for related matters; to provide for an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

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SECTION 1.

10 This Act shall be known and may be cited as the "Georgia Fights Terrorism Act."

11SECTION 2.12Article 1 of Chapter 3 of Title 35 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to13general provisions concerning the Georgia Bureau of Investigation, is amended by revising

14 Code Section 35-3-8.1, relating to power of bureau to assist other law enforcement agencies,15 as follows:

16 "35-3-8.1.

17 (a) Upon request of the governing authority or chief law enforcement officer of any 18 municipality, the sheriff of any county, the chief of the county police force of any county 19 having a population of more than 100,000 according to the United States decennial census 20 of 1970 or any future such census, the a judge of the superior court of any county of this 21 state, or the Governor, the director, in unusual circumstances, may, and in the case of a 22 request by the Governor, shall, direct the bureau to render assistance in any criminal case, 23 in the prevention or detection of violations of law, or in the detection or apprehension of 24 persons violating the criminal laws of this state, any other state, or the United States.

(b) The bureau shall be authorized to work independently, work concurrently with other law enforcement agencies, and request the assistance of other law enforcement agencies when, in the sole discretion of the director, such independent work, concurrent work, or request for assistance would not compromise the successful completion of cases involving the identification, investigation, arrest, and prosecution of an individual or groups of individuals for violation of laws concerning domestic, cyber, biological, chemical, and nuclear terrorism."

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SECTION 3.

This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming lawwithout such approval

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SECTION 4.

36 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
