## **A PROCLAMATION**

## CHILDREN'S VISION AND LEARNING MONTH

WHEREAS:	As students and their parents prepare to start a new school year, they are met with an opportune time to focus on the importance of good vision and its connection to learning; and
WHEREAS:	According to the American Foundation for Vision Awareness, one in four school-age children have vision problems, and approximately 18 million children, a number which unfortunately includes many Georgians, will not complete eye examinations with a certified vision care professional prior to entering school; and
WHEREAS:	The American Optometric Association estimates that sixty percent of students often identified as "problem learners" have undetected vision problems; and
WHEREAS:	Every child should have the opportunity to learn and achieve their full potential and proper eye care and treatment can help ensure that students are able to find success in classrooms and beyond; and
WHEREAS:	Children's Vision and Learning Month is an opportunity to bring awareness to this important issue and educate parents, teachers, and the general public about the importance of good vision for Georgia's students; now
THEREFORE:	I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim August 2024, as CHILDREN'S VISION AND LEARNING MONTH in Georgia.
