APROCLAMATION

COMMUNITY HEALTH CENTERS WEEK

WHEREAS: Federally Qualified Health Centers in Georgia provide high quality primary and preventative health care to more than 700,000 people in the State of Georgia, including more than 203,000 Medicaid recipients

and 189,000 uninsured patients, reducing medical costs for uninsured patients by \$161 million; and

WHEREAS: Community Health Centers contribute more than \$1 billion per year to Georgia's economy through

indirect and induced economic activity, including \$163 million in household income and 4,434 Georgia

jobs; and

WHEREAS: Community Health Centers recruit and retain more than 450 health care professionals where they are

most needed and offer access to a wide range of cost-effective medical and dental services, behavioral health services, prescription medicines, health education, nutrition counseling, translation services,

community outreach, transportation, and other support programs; and

WHEREAS: Community Health Centers have a track record spanning more than five decades of controlling costs,

documented in several studies which show that rates of costly emergency room visits, hospitalizations, and specialty care referrals are much lower among Community Health Center patients than patients of

other providers; and

WHEREAS: Community Health Centers work in partnership with other health care providers, local hospitals, health

departments, social service agencies, and health related organizations to maximize resources and assure

that services are coordinated to improve the health status of the community; and

WHEREAS: Georgia's Community Health Centers and their state organization, the Georgia Primary Care

Association, have worked diligently to increase the number of Community Health Centers in Georgia, demonstrating commendable efforts in continuous quality improvement, the implementation of new health care initiatives such as integration of medical services and behavioral health, and utilization of

the latest technology to improve operations and delivery of services to more Georgians; and

WHEREAS: Community Health Centers have made valuable contributions in expanding access to health care, have

an outstanding record of service, and have shown dedication to improving health care and the health

status of all Georgians; now

THEREFORE: I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim August 4-10, 2024, as

COMMUNITY HEALTH CENTERS WEEK in Georgia.
