ELECTRICAL SAFETY MONTH

WHEREAS:

Hundreds of people in the United States suffer injury or death each year due to electric-

related incidents; and

WHEREAS:

Electrical home structure fires account for many civilian deaths each year, and property

damage resulting from these fires amounts to over \$1.4 billion annually across the

United States; and

WHEREAS:

Following basic electrical safety precautions can help prevent thousands of people

from being injured or killed each year; and

WHEREAS:

Citizens are encouraged to inspect their homes and workplaces for possible electrical hazards, advised to protect their homes and families with the latest safety technology, such as ground-fault circuit interrupters, arc-fault circuit interrupters, surge protective devices, and tamper resistant receptacles, and urged to install, test, and properly

maintain an adequate number of smoke alarms; and

WHEREAS:

The Electrical Safety Foundation (ESFI) is dedicated to highlighting electrical safety in the home, school, and workplace through education, awareness, and advocacy; and

WHEREAS:

The State of Georgia promotes the importance of establishing and practicing electrical safety habits to reduce the number of electrically related fires, injuries, and deaths; now

THEREFORE:

I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim May 2024,

as ELECTRICAL SAFETY MONTH in Georgia.
