A PROCLAMATION

FABRY DISEASE AWARENESS MONTH

WHEREAS:	Fabry disease is a progressive, potentially life-threatening inherited disorder, caused by variants in the GLA gene leading to a damaging buildup of lipids in multiple body organs and systems, including the heart, brain, kidneys, lungs, and the nervous, auditory, and digestive systems, and more; and
WHEREAS:	While newborn screening for Fabry disease does exist, recent studies have suggested a higher prevalence of this disease than previously expected, creating the possibility for many children and adults to remain undiagnosed and untreated; and
WHEREAS:	People with Fabry disease experience chronic pain in their extremities, temperature sensitivity, and gastrointestinal issues beginning in childhood. Adults may experience stroke, kidney and/or heart failure, lung disease, and hearing loss at relatively young ages; and
WHEREAS:	Early diagnosis through testing and treatment is vital to reduce the occurrence of adverse quality of life and life-threatening complications. There are currently three FDA-approved treatments available to reduce symptoms and slow down the onset of organ damage; and
WHEREAS:	The month of April is designated to raise awareness about Fabry disease among the public and medical experts, leading to increased research toward an ultimate cure; now
THEREFORE:	I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim April 2024, as FABRY DISEASE AWARENESS MONTH in Georgia.
