## **A PROCLAMATION**

## **INTERSTITIAL CYSTITIS AWARENESS MONTH**

WHEREAS:	Interstitial Cystitis/Bladder Pain Syndrome (IC/BPS) is a chronic bladder condition that typically consists of multiple symptoms including recurring pelvic pain, pressure, or discomfort in the bladder and pelvic region, and urinary frequency and urgency; and
WHEREAS:	Nearly 12 million Americans, with 3 to 8 million women and 1 to 4 million men, suffer from this condition, for which there is no known root cause or existing cure; and
WHEREAS:	Appropriate diagnosis can take months or years for patients as there is no specific test to identify IC/BPS, and treatment options and levels of relief vary greatly from patient to patient; and
WHEREAS:	IC/BPS involves chronic pain which can greatly impact a patient's everyday activities, including the ability to work and mental health; and
WHEREAS:	IC/BPS patients have historically faced stigma and a lack of understanding for their condition due to limited awareness and existing treatment for their condition; now
THEREFORE:	I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim September 2024, as INTERSTITIAL CYSTITIS AWARENESS MONTH in Georgia.

In witness thereof, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Seal of the Executive Department to be affixed this 7<sup>th</sup> day of June in the year of our Lord, Two Thousand and Twenty-Four.
