commitment to social justice, and many of our Country's most central tenets; and

WHEREAS: The first Jewish Georgians first settled in this state in 1733, and have played a central

role in the development of our state, including as members of the Armed Forces of

the United States and the Georgia National Guard; and

WHEREAS: Jewish Americans have made significant contributions to the arts, entertainment,

science and technology, government, business, culinary traditions, and other fields in the United States, and have played an important role in shaping American culture; and

WHEREAS: The Month of May has been named Jewish American Heritage Month across the

United States since 2006, and the State of Georgia joins in recognizing and celebrating

the positive impact on society made by Jewish Americans; now

THEREFORE: I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim May 2024,

as JEWISH AMERICAN HERITAGE MONTH in Georgia.
