## **A PROCLAMATION**

## PEDIATRIC FEEDING DISORDER AWARENESS MONTH

- **WHEREAS:** Every bite of food for children with Pediatric Feeding Disorder (PFD) can be painful, scary, or simply impossible to swallow, potentially impeding nutrition, development, growth, and overall well-being; and
- WHEREAS:The Journal of Pediatric Gastroenterology and Nutrition defines PFD as impaired oral<br/>intake that is not age- appropriate and is associated with medical, nutritional, feeding<br/>skills, and/or psychosocial dysfunction; and
- WHEREAS: The American Academy of Pediatrics and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention identify nutrition during the first 1,000 days of life as a critical factor to early brain growth, development of the central nervous system, and lifelong mental health; and
- **WHEREAS:** PFD can affect all aspects of life, placing medical, emotional, financial, educational, and social burdens on children and families alike; and
- **WHEREAS:** Raising awareness for pediatric feeding disorder (PFD) will help create a world in which children with PFD will thrive by accelerating identification, igniting research, and promoting collaborative care and support for children and families; now
- **THEREFORE:** I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim April 2024, as PEDIATRIC FEEDING DISORDER AWARENESS MONTH in Georgia.
