A PROCLAMATION

PREECLAMPSIA AWARENESS DAY

WHEREAS:	Preeclampsia, including HELLP syndrome and eclampsia, is a dangerous condition of pregnancy that can, in its severest form, lead to maternal and/or infant mortality or premature birth with significant health risks for the mother and baby; and
WHEREAS:	As many as 320,000 cases of preeclampsia are diagnosed in America every year with approximately 25% resulting in severe, life-threatening consequences to a pregnant woman and her baby; and
WHEREAS:	Increased public education of the signs and symptoms of preeclampsia, HELLP syndrome, and eclampsia can help women recognize the condition and seek appropriate medical; and
WHEREAS:	Prenatal education should include recognition of those signs and symptoms including spikes in maternal blood pressure, sudden swelling of face and hands, severe upper abdominal pain, blurred vision, persistent headaches, breathlessness; and
WHEREAS:	Many citizens of Georgia have joined with the Preeclampsia Foundation to raise public awareness to minimize maternal and infant illness and death due to preeclampsia; now
THEREFORE:	I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim May 18, 2024, as PREECLAMPSIA AWARENESS DAY in Georgia.

In witness thereof, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Seal of the Executive Department to be affixed this 25nd day of April in the year of our Lord, Two Thousand and Twenty-Four.
