A PROCLAMATION

SAFETY MONTH

WHEREAS:

A lack of knowledge concerning general safety precautions and risks, as well as good

preparation for emergencies can result in unintentional injuries or death; and

WHEREAS:

The cost of unintentional injuries can be catastrophic to workers and their employers

and causes great suffering among individuals and their families; and

WHEREAS:

Georgia residents and all workers deserve to live in communities that promote safe

and healthy living; and

WHEREAS:

Organizations such as The National Safety Council Southeastern Chapter work alongside the State of Georgia to promote best practices and procedures to increase safety, protection, and health in business and industry, in schools and colleges, on

roads and highways, and in homes and communities; and

WHEREAS:

The summer months create a season of increased risk of unintentional injuries, and Georgians are encouraged to learn how to prepare for and ultimately prevent the

possibility of unintentional harm; now

THEREFORE:

I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim June 2024,

as SAFETY MONTH in Georgia.
