





### TAIWANESE AMERICAN HERITAGE WEEK

- WHEREAS:** Taiwanese Americans have made significant contributions to our society, economy, culture, and other fields; and

- WHEREAS:** Many Taiwanese Americans in Georgia are employed in highly skilled professions, such as university professors, medical doctors, engineers, technology professionals, attorneys, business professionals, and entrepreneurs; and
- WHEREAS:** The Taiwanese community in Atlanta supports a Taiwanese-speaking Presbyterian church in Duluth city, as well as two Taiwanese Language and Culture schools that teach children about Taiwanese culture, music, customs, and language; and
- WHEREAS:** Organizations across the state, including the Atlanta Taiwanese American Association, provide Taiwanese Americans in Georgia with support, camaraderie, and valuable networking opportunities; and
- WHEREAS:** During Asian American Heritage Month, we celebrate Taiwanese American Heritage Week and reflect on the contributions of Taiwanese Americans to the cultural, economic, and social fabric of our state; now
- THEREFORE:** I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim May 12-19, 2024, as TAIWANESE AMERICAN HERITAGE WEEK in Georgia.
