## **A PROCLAMATION**

## TARTAN DAY

WHEREAS: The Declaration of Arbroath, the Scottish Declaration of Independence, was signed

on or about April 6, 1320; and

WHEREAS: Scottish Americans have played a significant role in shaping our nation. Many of the

signers of the Declaration of Independence as well as governors of nine of our original

thirteen colonies were of Scottish ancestry; and

WHEREAS: Generations of Scottish Americans have made valuable contributions to our state and

national history, in the fields of science, architecture, medicine, government,

economics, literature, and the performing arts; and

WHEREAS: Georgians of Scottish ancestry are dedicated to perpetuating Scottish traditions,

culture, and heritage, as well as promoting fellowship and the dispensing of charitable

and educational assistance; and

WHEREAS: The State of Georgia has a rich history filled with the character and strength of a

diverse population, including the Scots and Scots-Irish; now

THEREFORE: I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim April 6,

2024, as TARTAN DAY in Georgia.

In witness thereof, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Seal of the Executive Department to be affixed this 8<sup>th</sup> day of March in the year of our Lord, Two Thousand and Twenty-Four.
