## **A PROCLAMATION**

## **TELEHEALTH AWARENESS WEEK**

WHEREAS:	Telehealth is the use of electronic information and technologies, including videoconferencing, the Internet, store-and-forward imaging, streaming media, and wireless communications, to support virtual clinical health care, education for patients as well as healthcare professionals, public health, and health administration; and
WHEREAS:	Telehealth puts an emphasis on coordinated, patient-centered healthcare, and provides increased access to medical specialists by offering timely and more convenient consultation opportunities; and
WHEREAS:	In addition to providing access to remote clinical healthcare, telehealth includes patient learning, continuing medical education, provider training, and administrative meetings; and
WHEREAS:	Telehealth services in the State of Georgia include hospital ICU, acute stroke, pediatric emergency and critical care, and infectious disease care; community medical homes with maternal fetal medicine, pre and post-surgery consultation, psychiatry, sickle cell, and nutrition counseling; and innovative portals to care such as home monitoring and consultation, school based care, and special locations for victims of crime; and
WHEREAS:	Telehealth Awareness Week serves as an opportunity to encourage all Georgians to learn more about telehealth and showcase how virtual care improves access to quality healthcare services for all communities across our Peach State; now
THEREFORE:	I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim September 15-21, 2024, as TELEHEALTH AWARENESS WEEK in Georgia.
