A PROCLAMATION

VIETNAM VETERANS DAY

WHEREAS:	Many veterans returning home from Vietnam did not receive the respect and gratitude that they deserve for serving in our nation's Armed Forces because of the unpopularity of this eleven-year conflict; and
WHEREAS:	The Vietnam Veterans living in Georgia today are Part of a generation who put their personal lives on hold and answered our Nation's call of duty; and
WHEREAS:	On State Capital grounds and across America, memorials and monuments stand in eternal tribute to the service members who held as prisoners of war, those still unaccounted for or missing in action, and those who made the ultimate sacrifice during the Vietnam War; and
WHEREAS:	Georgia's Vietnam Veterans are to be highly commended for their courage, bravery, devotion to duty, and sacrifice in the fight for peace and democracy; and
WHEREAS:	The State of Georgia is committed to honoring these Georgians with grateful hears for their contributions and sacrifices while wearing the uniform of the United States Armed Forces during the Vietnam War; now
THEREFORE:	I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim March 29, 2024, as VIETNAM VETERANS DAY in Georgia.

In witness thereof, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Seal of the Executive Department to be affixed this 21st day of March in the year of our Lord, Two Thousand and Twenty-Four.
