A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Part 2 of Article 3 of Chapter 12 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia 1 Annotated, relating to offenses related to minors generally, so as to provide for limitations 2 3 of defense that a sexually exploitive visual medium is digitally altered for the offense of 4 sexual exploitation of children; to provide for the offense of grooming a minor; to provide 5 for definitions; to provide for a penalty; to prohibit a certain defense; to provide for venue 6 for certain conduct involving a minor; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting 7 laws; and for other purposes.

- 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

10 Part 2 of Article 3 of Chapter 12 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, 11 relating to offenses related to minors generally, is amended by adding a new subsection to 12 Code Section 16-12-100, relating to sexual exploitation of children, reporting violation, civil 13 forfeiture, and penalties, to read as follows: "(b.2) It shall not constitute a defense in a prosecution for a violation of this Code section

- that prior to or during the accused's creation, reproduction, publishing, promotion, selling, 15

23	(a) As used in this Code section, the term:		
24	(1) 'Computer' has the same meaning as provided in Code Section 16-9-92.		
25	(2) 'Electronic device' has the same meaning as provided in Code Section 16-12-100.2.		
26	(3) 'Minor' means any person under the age of 18 years.		
27	(4) 'Pattern of conduct or communication' means a pattern of conduct composed of a		
28	series of acts over a period of time, however short, evidencing a continuity of purpose.		
29	(5) 'Sexual offense' has the same meaning as provided in Code Section 17-10-6.2.		
30	(6) 'Sexual servitude' has the same meaning as provided in Code Section 16-5-46.		
31	(b) A person over the age of 18 and no less than 48 months older than the alleged victim		
32	commits the offense of grooming of a minor when such person knowingly and intentionally		
33	engages in a pattern of conduct or communication in person; through a third party; through		
34	the use of an electronic device, a computer, social media, or text messages; or by any other		
35	means to gain access to, to gain the compliance of, to prepare, to persuade, to induce, or		
36	to coerce a minor to engage in a sexual offense or trafficking of persons for sexual		
37	servitude.		
38	(c) Any person who violates this Code section shall be guilty of a felony and punished by		
39	imprisonment for not less than one nor more than five years.		
40	(d) It shall not be a defense to prosecution under this Code section that no sexual offense		

41 <u>or trafficking of persons for sexual servitude was accomplished or attempted.</u>

42	(e) A person shall be subject to prosecution in this state pursuant to Code Section 17-2-1
43	for any conduct made unlawful by this Code section which the person engages in while:
44	(1) Either within or outside of this state if such conduct involves a minor who resides in
45	this state or another person believed by such person to be a minor residing in this state;
46	<u>or</u>
47	(2) Within this state if such conduct involves a minor who resides within or outside this
48	state or another person believed by such person to be a minor residing within or outside
49	this state."
