A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Chapter 4 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to 1 2 vocational, technical, and adult education, so as to redesignate the High-demand Career 3 Initiatives Program as the High Demand Apprenticeship Program; to reduce contract award 4 amounts from \$10,000.00 to \$5,000.00 per apprentice; to increase the cap on allowable 5 apprentices from five to ten; to authorize certain expenditures by the Office of Workforce 6 Development; to provide for the State Board of the Technical College System of Georgia to 7 establish the Public Service Apprenticeship Program to promote the creation and expansion 8 of registered apprenticeship programs in this state; to provide the purpose of such program; 9 to authorize the board to enter into contracts with public service sponsors for the successful 10 completion of the education, training, and other requirements of apprentices in Georgia; to 11 provide application requirements and procedures; to authorize contract completion awards; 12 to require a report; to authorize the acceptance of grants and other funds; to provide for 13 definitions; to provide for rules and regulations; to provide for a repealer; to amend Code 14 Section 20-2-161.4 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to accessing HOPE 15 scholarship funds for dual enrolled students and termination, so as to make a conforming 16 change; to amend Code Section 50-36-1 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating 17 to verification requirements, procedures, and conditions, exceptions, regulations, and 18 criminal and other penalties for violations, so as to revise the definition of the term "public

19	benefit" to include apprenticeships; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws;

21	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

PART I SECTION 1-1.

Chapter 4 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to vocational, technical, and adult education, is amended by revising Code Section 20-4-151, relating to purpose of High-demand Career Initiatives Program, employer partnerships, required information, contracts, awards, and limitations, as follows:

28 "20-4-151.

29 (a) Subject to appropriations of funds by the General Assembly for this purpose, the board, 30 in coordination with the Department of Labor, the Department of Economic Development, 31 the Department of Education, and the Office of Planning and Budget, shall establish and 32 administer a program through the Office of Workforce Development to be called the 33 High-demand Career Initiatives High Demand Apprenticeship Program. The purpose of 34 the program High Demand Apprenticeship Program is to incentivize apprenticeship 35 sponsors to establish new or grow existing registered apprenticeship programs in Georgia 36 in order to support the growth of apprenticeship programs and expand high-quality 37 work-based work based learning experiences in high-demand fields and careers for persons 38 in Georgia.

39 (b) An employer sponsor may apply to the board for the opportunity to enter into a
40 contract to perform the requirements of conducting an apprenticeship program for a
41 specific apprentice. Such contract shall require the employer sponsor's apprentice to
42 successfully complete an apprenticeship program.

43 (c) The board shall provide upon request and on the Technical College System of
44 Georgia's <u>public</u> website information about the <u>program High Demand Apprenticeship</u>
45 <u>Program</u>, the application, application instructions, and the application period established
46 each year for contracts for services available under the <u>such</u> program.

(d) Upon successful completion of the requirements of a contract under this article, the
board shall provide a contract completion award to the employer sponsor. The contract
completion award amount shall be determined based on the number of hours of education
and training required for the successful completion of the apprenticeship under such
apprenticeship program but shall not exceed:

52 (1) \$10,000.00 per apprentice for contracts entered into before July 1, 2024; and

53 (2) \$5,000.00 per apprentice for contracts entered into on or after July 1, 2024.

54 (e) Each employer sponsor shall only be eligible to enter into contracts under this article55 for up to:

56 (1) Five five apprentices per year through the end of Fiscal Year 2024; and

57 (2) Ten apprentices per year beginning with the Fiscal Year 2025 and continuing each
 58 fiscal year thereafter.

(f) An apprenticeship sponsor may assist with the application for and completion of anapprenticeship contract authorized by this article.

61 (g) Beginning July 1, 2024, and continuing thereafter, the Office of Workforce

62 <u>Development shall be authorized to:</u>

63 (1) Provide initial funding for up to \$2,500.00 per apprentice of the amount provided for

64 in paragraph (2) of subsection (d) of this Code section; and

65 (2) Provide funding to award employer sponsors up to \$2,500.00 per apprentice 12
