WHEREAS: More than 29 million Americans, including 900,000 Georgians, are building lives in

recovery from substance use disorders and mental illness; and

WHEREAS: Recovery is Real; Recovery saves lives, restores families, strengthens communities, and

builds a stronger workforce, making Georgia a safer and healthier state; and

WHEREAS: The voice of the recovery community is the single most important voice in the

recovery process. Peer led recovery community organizations across our state continue to educate the public and policymakers on the need for access to prevention,

treatment, and peer-based recovery support services; and

WHEREAS: On Addiction Recovery Awareness Day and throughout the year, we recommit

ourselves to helping Georgians who are seeking the treatment they need, and we

celebrate Georgians who are embracing a life of recovery; now
