A PROCLAMATION

ANEMIA AWARENESS DAY

WHEREAS: Anemia is a common blood disorder affecting millions of individuals worldwide,

characterized by low hemoglobin levels and often leading to fatigue, weakness, and

impaired quality of life; and

WHEREAS: Anemia can be caused by various factors including nutritional deficiencies, chronic

diseases, genetic conditions, and blood loss, and impacts individuals of all ages and

backgrounds; and

WHEREAS: Anemia often goes undiagnosed or untreated due to lack of awareness about its

symptoms, risk factors, and available treatment options; and

WHEREAS: Increasing public awareness about anemia can empower individuals to seek early

diagnosis, improve their health outcomes, and reduce the burden on the healthcare

system; and

WHEREAS: Anemia Awareness Day provides an opportunity to educate the public, support

research initiatives, and encourage healthy practices to prevent and manage anemia;

and

WHEREAS: Recognizing a day for anemia awareness would unite communities, healthcare

professionals, and policymakers in addressing this critical public health concern; now

THEREFORE: I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim February

13th, 2025, as ANEMIA AWARENESS DAY in Georgia.
