A PROCLAMATION

AUTISM ACCEPTANCE DAY

WHEREAS:

Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) is a complex developmental condition that affects an estimated 1 in 40 children in Georgia, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's Metropolitan Atlanta Developmental Disabilities Surveillance Program (MADDSP); and

WHEREAS:

Early diagnosis, intervention, and access to specialized services are critical to improving the quality of life for individuals with autism and ensuring they reach their full potential; and

WHEREAS:

The Georgia Autism Initiative, in collaboration with state agencies, healthcare providers, and advocacy organizations, works diligently to support individuals with autism and their families by expanding access to early screening, behavioral therapy, and educational programs; and

WHEREAS:

The Georgia Department of Education, through its Exceptional Student Services Division, continues to provide essential educational and support programs for students with autism, ensuring they receive the tools and resources needed for academic and social success; and

WHEREAS:

Individuals with autism contribute meaningfully to our communities, workforce, and society, and it is our collective responsibility to create an inclusive environment that values and supports all individuals, regardless of neurological differences; and

WHEREAS:

World Autism Acceptance Day is observed annually on April 2, serving as an opportunity for communities across Georgia to promote awareness, education, and inclusion while advocating for policies and initiatives that support individuals with autism and their families; now

THEREFORE:

I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim April 2, 2025, as AUTISM ACCEPTANCE DAY in Georgia.
