Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD) is a progressive lung disease caused

by damage to the airways or parts of the lungs that makes it hard to breathe; and

WHEREAS:

An estimated 30 million Americans are affected by COPD, but only 17 million

Americans are diagnosed; and

WHEREAS:

COPD is the sixth leading cause of death in the United States and the projected cost

attributed to COPD in 2029 is \$60.5 billion; and

WHEREAS:

While incurable, COPD is both preventable and treatable. Health promotion and

education, which inform the public of COPD, play a role in disease prevention.; and

WHEREAS:

COPD Awareness Month is a time to recognize commitment to policy improvements

and the individuals with COPD who contribute to our communities; now

THEREFORE:

I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim
