CHRONIC OBSTRUCTIVE PULMONARY DISEASE AWARENESS MONTH

- WHEREAS:** Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD) is a progressive lung disease caused by damage to the airways or parts of the lungs that makes it hard to breathe; and
- WHEREAS:** An estimated 30 million Americans are affected by COPD, but only 17 million Americans are diagnosed; and
- WHEREAS:** COPD is the sixth leading cause of death in the United States and the projected cost attributed to COPD in 2029 is \$60.5 billion; and
- WHEREAS:** While incurable, COPD is both preventable and treatable. Health promotion and education, which inform the public of COPD, play a role in disease prevention. ; and
- WHEREAS:** COPD Awareness Month is a time to recognize commitment to policy improvements and the individuals with COPD who contribute to our communities; now
- THEREFORE:** I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim November 2025, as CHRONIC OBSTRUCTIVE PULMONARY DISEASE AWARENESS MONTH in Georgia.
