## **A PROCLAMATION**

## **FABRY DISEASE AWARENESS MONTH**

WHEREAS: Fabry disease is a progressive, potentially life-threatening inherited

disorder caused by variants in the GLA gene leading to a damaging buildup of lipids in multiple body organs and systems, including the heart,

brain, kidneys, lungs, and the nervous, auditory, and digestive systems; and

WHEREAS: People with Fabry Disease experience chronic pain in their extremities,

reduced ability to perspire, heat intolerance and overheating, and gastrointestinal issues beginning in childhood. Adults may experience stroke, kidney and/or heart failure, lung disease, and hearing loss at

relatively young ages; and

WHEREAS: Newborn screening for Fabry disease is performed in several states and

studies show a higher prevalence of 1 in 4,128 newborns than previously expected 1 in 50,000 newborns. This suggests many children and adults

remain undiagnosed and untreated; and

WHEREAS: Early diagnosis with genetic testing and treatment is vital to reduce the

occurrence of adverse quality of life and life-threatening complications. There are currently three FDA-approved treatments available to reduce

symptoms and slow the onset of organ damage; now

THEREFORE: I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby

proclaim April 2025, as FABRY DISEASE AWARENESS MONTH in

Georgia.
