A PROCLAMATION

GEORGIA ARBOR DAY

WHEREAS: The first Arbor Day was celebrated in 1872 as a special day for planting trees and has

grown to thousands of celebrations in communities across our nation each year; and

WHEREAS: Community trees improve public health and air and water quality, reduce the erosion

of precious topsoil, increase property values and economic vitality in business areas, increase energy efficiency through shade, provide habitats for wildlife, and beautify

neighborhoods, parks, streets, and residential developments; and

WHEREAS: The Georgia Forestry Commission's urban and community forestry programs

continue to make great strides on projects that will improve tree canopy and bring increased environmental, economic, and social benefits to all communities throughout

the state; and

WHEREAS: On Georgia Arbor Day, community forestry leaders and partners will join together to

celebrate and recognize the important initiatives around this great state to increase tree

coverage and growth; and

WHEREAS: Georgia Forestry Commission's Arbor Day programs encourage citizens to plant trees

and to leave a legacy for present and future generations; now

THEREFORE: I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim February

21, 2025, as GEORGIA ARBOR DAY in Georgia.
