JEWISH AMERICAN HERITAGE MONTH

WHEREAS: Jewish immigrants, since their arrival in the United States in the 16th century, have

played a central role in the creation, growth, freedom, prosperity, and strength of the

United States of America; and

WHEREAS: The history of the Jewish people and the enduring values of the Jewish faith were vital

> sources of inspiration for the founding of the United States, the Civil Rights movement, America's global leadership in the cause of freedom, and many of our

Country's most central tenets; and

WHEREAS: The first Jewish immigrants in Georgia settled in 1733, and have played a central role

in the development of our state, including serving as members of the Armed Forces

of the United States and the Georgia National Guard; and

WHEREAS: Jewish Americans have played an important role in shaping American culture through

their contributions to the arts, entertainment, science and technology, government,

business, culinary traditions, and a host of other fields; and

WHEREAS: Since 2006, the Month of May has been recognized as Jewish American Heritage

Month across the United States, and the State of Georgia joins in commemorating and

celebrating the positive impact on society made by Jewish Americans; now

THEREFORE: I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim May 2025,

as JEWISH AMERICAN HERITAGE MONTH in Georgia.

In witness thereof, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Seal of the Executive Department to be affixed this 21st day of April in the year of our Lord, Two Thousand and Twenty-Five.
