WHEREAS:

Leukemia is a type of cancer that affects the blood and bone marrow, impacting

thousands of individuals and families in Georgia and across the nation; and

WHEREAS:

Leukemia is categorized into acute and chronic types, affecting children and adults alike, with forms such as Acute Myeloid Leukemia (AML), Acute Lymphoblastic Leukemia (ALL), Chronic Myeloid Leukemia (CML), and Chronic Lymphocytic

Leukemia (CLL), each presenting unique treatment challenges; and

WHEREAS:

Early symptoms—such as fatigue, fever, swollen lymph nodes, and bruising—call for timely diagnosis and treatment, with advanced diagnostic methods like blood tests,

genetic analysis, and imaging guiding tailored care; and

WHEREAS:

Treatments such as chemotherapy, stem cell transplantation, targeted therapies, and new approaches like CAR-T cell therapy offer improved patient outcomes and renewed hope. Continued research and clinical trials advance understanding and develop innovative therapies, raising survival rates and enhancing lives; and

WHEREAS:

September is recognized nationally as Leukemia Awareness Month, dedicated to increasing public understanding of the disease, promoting early detection, and supporting research efforts; now

THEREFORE:

I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim September 2025, as LEUKEMIA AWARENESS MONTH in Georgia.
