A PROCLAMATION

NATIONAL FAMILY CAREGIVERS MONTH

WHEREAS: More than 1.26 million Georgians today serve as family caregivers for their loved ones

who are older adults or living with a disability, which provides an estimated economic

value of \$16.3 billion to Georgia; and

WHEREAS: One out of five family caregivers juggle everyday life tasks and work full- or part-time

in addition to serving as a vital member of the care team for their loved ones. Whether it be for a senior with Alzheimer's or a child with special needs, the required attention

can be non-stop; and

WHEREAS: With the responsibility of family caregivers increasing every year, it is more essential

than ever to encourage these everyday heroes to take time for self-care so they may

continue their mission of providing loving care; and

WHEREAS: The Georgia Department of Human Services' Division of Aging Services administers

Older Americans Act programs and services that assist caregivers in providing home

and community-based care for loved ones; and

WHEREAS: During National Family Caregivers Month, it is important to celebrate the many

contributions of caregivers and encourage communities, employers, and others to

support their mission; now

THEREFORE: I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim

November 2025, as NATIONAL FAMILY CAREGIVERS MONTH in Georgia.
