A PROCLAMATION

NEUROMYELITIS OPTICA SPECTRUM DISORDER AWARENESS MONTH

WHEREAS: Neuromyelitis Optica Spectrum Disorder (NMOSD) is a rare and relatively unknown

autoimmune disease that currently has no cure; and

WHEREAS: NMOSD attacks the central nervous system and can cause lifetime disability, including

blindness and/or paralysis; and

WHEREAS: The cause of NMOSD is still a mystery and there are a few approved treatments for

most patients with NMOSD; but there are a number of patients who have no

treatment options; and

WHEREAS: When mistaken for other diseases, treatments can exacerbate NMOSD symptoms and

increasing awareness about NMOSD has caused diagnoses to rise, as doctors have

become more likely to recognize the varying manifestations of the disease; and

WHEREAS: The NMOSD community is dedicated to increasing awareness and understanding of

this disease to promote research, improve patient care, and outcomes, and ultimately

find a cure; now

THEREFORE: I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim March

2025, as NEUROMYELITIS OPTICA SPECTRUM DISORDER AWARENESS

MONTH in Georgia.
